By the time George Washington was 20 years old, the residents of Ephrata had built impressive buildings, created scores of artwork and musical compositions, and published the largest book printed in the colonies.

Now your students can learn about life in this early American community through these hands-on programs.

## Community Days

During this program an "open house" format allows many students from different schools and home-school students to explore a range of learning stations located throughout the Cloister grounds. Travel at your own pace from station to station in any order. On these days you might: •Visit the doctor •Write with a quill pen Learn about colonial clothing
